


The New Danish Gambling Law

Authority, regulation and challenges





- Placed within the Ministry of Taxation
- 94 employees placed on 12 locations throughout Denmark
- The head office is located in Høje Taastrup
- The budget is approximately DKK 70 million

The purpose of the Act on Gambling

To maintain the consumption of gambling services at a moderate level

To ensure public order and to prevent gambling as a means to support crime To protect young people and other vulnerable groups from being exploited through gambling or developing a gambling addiction

To protect players by ensuring that gambling is provided in a fair, responsible and transparent manner

- Land based casinos

- Charity lotteries

Restricted number of licences

- Lottery (monopoly)
 - Online bingo
 - Scratch cards
- Class lottery
- Horse and dog racing

Online casino and betting




- Estimate 2013
- Betting: 1.400 mill. DKK (185 mill. EURO)
- Online casino: 950 mill. DKK (125 mill. EURO)
- Both: 2.350 mill. DKK (310 mill. EURO)
